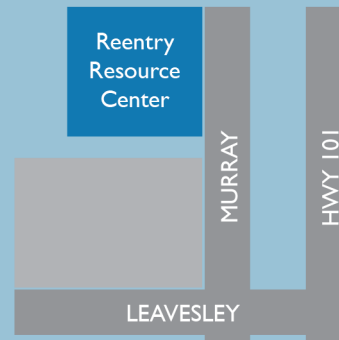

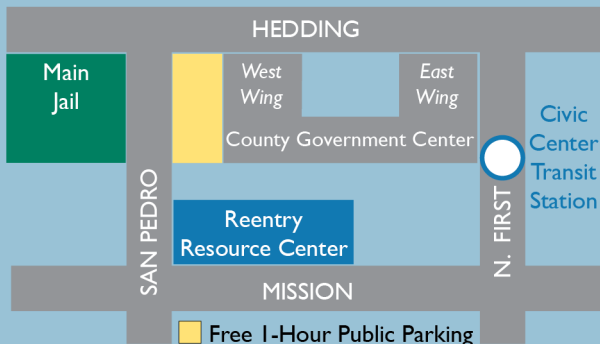

Mobile Medical Unit (MMU):

General Assistance:

The Social Services Agency is available at the SJ RRC for screenings and applications for General RRC Assistance, CalFresh (food stamps), and Medi-Cal Mon.-Fri. 8am-5pm. Behavioral Health Services Department:

The Public Defender's Record Clearance Program (expungement) holds office hours at the RRC Mon./Fri 9:30am- 11am and Tues./Thurs. 1-4pm.
